kingdom..." but
that is a later
doxology.

- **Question:** In
Matthew 7, what
analogy does
Jesus use for
someone who
hears His words
and does them?

Answer: A wise
man who built
his house on a
rock.

The Sermon on the
Mount is also rich with
comparative questions.
Expect prompts that
ask you to differentiate
between the teachings
of the Pharisees and
the higher standard
Jesus presents. For
example: "What does
Jesus say about the
commandment 'You

shall not murder'?" The answer involves being angry with a brother without cause.

MIRACLES AND AUTHORITY (CHAPTERS 8-10)

Matthew carefully selects miracles that demonstrate Jesus's authority over disease, demons, nature, and even death. In the context of **Matthew Bible Quiz Bowl Questions And Answers**, these chapters often provide the basis for "sequence" questions.

- **Question:**
Which miracle appears first in Matthew chapter 8?
- **Answer:** The cleansing of a leper (Matthew 8:1-4).

- **Question:** What specific instruction did Jesus give to the disciples when He sent them out in chapter 10?
- **Answer:** "Do not go among the

Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel."

A common quiz bowl trap is the "two demoniacs" detail. Because other Gospels mention one man, many students mistakenly think Matthew does too. Paying attention to such nuances separates good competitors from great ones.

PARABLES OF THE KINGDOM (CHAPTER 13)

Chapter 13 is a concentrated collection of parables that is virtually guaranteed to appear in any tournament. For high-quality **Matthew Bible Quiz Bowl Questions And Answers**, you

must know the distinct details of each parable.

- **Question:** In the Parable of the Sower, what do the seeds that fell among thorns represent?

Answer: Those who hear the word but allow the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches to choke it.

Answer: The Parable of the Dragnet (Matthew 13:47-50).

Note how the questions often focus on interpretation rather than just the narrative. Jesus Himself explains several of these parables, so be prepared to quote His explanations directly.

CONFRONTATIONS AND PREDICTIONS (CHAPTERS 14-20)

This middle section of Matthew includes the

feeding of the 5,000, Peter walking on water, the transfiguration, and teachings on forgiveness and marriage. When studying **Matthew Bible Quiz Bowl Questions And Answers** for this segment, pay close attention to dialogue.

- **Question:** When Jesus walked on water, what did Peter say to request to join Him?

Answer: "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water."
(Matthew 14:28)

- **Question:** At the transfiguration, which two Old Testament figures appeared with Jesus?

Answer: Moses and Elijah.

- **Question:**

According to Matthew 18, how many times should you forgive a brother who sins against you?

- **Answer:**

Seventy-seven times (or seventy times seven, depending on translation).

- **Question:** What did the rich young ruler ask Jesus?

Answer: "What good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" (Matthew 19:16)

Competitors often stumble on the "forgiveness" question because they recall the number 7 but forget the multiplication. Precision is paramount.

THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY AND CONTROVERSY (CHAPTERS 21-23)

As Jesus enters Jerusalem, the tension escalates. Questions from these chapters often involve direct quotations and confrontations with religious leaders.

- **Question:** What did the crowd shout when Jesus entered Jerusalem?

- **Answer:**

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Matthew 21:9)

- **Question:** Which fig tree did Jesus curse, and what happened

immediately?

Answer: He cursed a fig tree that had no fruit, and it withered immediately (Matthew 21:19).

- **Question:** In the Parable of the Two Sons, which son actually did the father's will?

Answer: The one who initially said "I will not" but later repented and went (Matthew 21:29).

- **Question:** Which chapter contains the "Seven Woes" pronounced upon the Pharisees?

Answer: Matthew 23.

The "Seven Woes" are a favorite in quiz bowl because they are enumerated and easy to turn into multiple-

choice or short-answer questions. Remember that each woe begins with "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!"

THE OLIVET DISCOURSE AND END TIMES (CHAPTERS 24-25)

This prophetic discourse is dense with signs, warnings, and parables. For **Matthew Bible Quiz Bowl Questions And Answers**, this section tests eschatological knowledge.

- **Question:** What did Jesus say would be the sign of His coming and the end of the age?

Answer: "The sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the

stars will fall from heaven..." (Matthew 24:29). Also note the abomination of desolation (verse 15).

- **Question:** In the Parable of the Ten Virgins, what did the foolish virgins lack?
Answer: Oil for their lamps.
- **Question:** In the Parable of the Talents, how many talents did the master give to the servant

who buried his talent?

Answer: One talent (Matthew 25:24-25).

- **Question:** According to Matthew 25, what will the King say to the righteous?
Answer: "Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." (Matthew 25:34)
