- **KATC 3** (ABC) – Your go-to for ABC programming and local news. Look for channel 3 or HD channel 1003.

- **KADN 15** (FOX) – For FOX sports, prime time, and local news, channel 15 (or 1015 for HD) is your destination.
- **KLAF 46** (NBC) – NBC programming is available on channel 46 and HD channel 1046.
- **LPB 24** (Louisiana Public Broadcasting) – For educational content, PBS shows, and local documentaries, check channel 24.

These foundational channels are included in nearly every Cox package, ensuring that Lafayette residents never miss important weather updates from the Acadiana region or their favorite network sitcoms.

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### HOW TO ACCESS THE COX CHANNEL GUIDE

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Gone are the days of needing a paper booklet. Cox has invested heavily in making their channel guide accessible through multiple platforms. The goal is to meet you where you are, whether you are sitting on the couch or checking your phone while on the go.

## Using the On-Screen Interactive Guide

The most common way to browse channels is through your TV. Your Cox Contour remote or standard cable box remote gives you direct access to the interactive channel guide. Simply press the **Guide** button. This will bring up a scrollable list of all available channels. You can sort by name, by package, or by genre (Sports, Movies, News, Kids).

The on-screen guide also allows you to look ahead up to two weeks. If you see a show you want to watch later, you can press the **Record** button on your remote to add it to your Cloud DVR, provided you have that service. This feature is a huge time-saver, especially during football season when LSU games and local high school sports are a big draw.

## The Cox Contour App and Online Portal

For those who prefer a digital solution, the **Cox Contour app** is your best friend. Available for iOS, Android, and smart devices, this app effectively turns your phone or tablet into a second TV. You can view the full Cox channel guide for Lafayette, set recordings, and even stream live TV over your home Wi-Fi.

If you are at your computer, logging into your Cox account on the official website provides the same functionality. The channel lineup is displayed in a clean, searchable format. Searching for a specific show or channel is often faster on the app or website than scrolling through the TV guide.

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### NAVIGATING THE CHANNEL PACKAGES AND TIERS

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Cox offers a variety of packages, and the channels you see in your guide depend entirely on the tier you subscribe to. Understanding these tiers is crucial for finding what you want.

## Starter and Popular TV

These are the entry-level packages. They include the local channels mentioned above, plus a solid selection of general entertainment networks. You will find channels like **TBS, TNT, USA Network, ESPN (for sports), HGTV, Discovery Channel, and Food Network**. For many families in Lafayette, this tier is sufficient for daily viewing. The typical channel numbers for these networks fall between local channels and the higher premium tiers, usually in the 30s, 40s, and 50s.

## Contour and Preferred TV

Stepping up to the Contour or Preferred tier unlocks a much broader range of content. This is where you gain access to more specialized networks. You can expect to see the full suite of **Viacom channels (MTV, Comedy Central, Nickelodeon), more sports networks (ESPN2, ESPNU, FS1), and lifestyle channels (BET, Travel Channel, Hallmark)**.

This tier is very popular in Lafayette because it includes channels that cover niche interests. For example, **History Channel, National Geographic, and Animal Planet** are all available here. If you have children, having access to the full range of **Disney Channel** and **Cartoon Network** options is a big plus.

## Premium Networks and Add-Ons

For the ultimate viewing experience, Cox allows you to layer premium networks onto your existing package. These are typically listed in the 300 through 500 range on your Cox channel guide.

- **HBO and Cinemax:** These are the classic premium channels, known for blockbuster movies and high-budget original series. Look for HBO in the 300s and Cinemax nearby.
- **Showtime and Starz:** These offer a different flavor of original content and films. They are often found in the 400s.
- **Sports & Information Packs:** You can add packages like the **Sports & Information Pack** to get channels like NFL RedZone, NBA TV, NHL Network, Golf Channel, and MLB Network. For news junkies, this pack often includes BBC World News and additional news feeds.
- **International Channels:** Cox serves the diverse community of Lafayette by offering specific add-ons for Spanish, French, Vietnamese, and other international programming.

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### TIPS FOR FINDING SPECIFIC CONTENT IN LAFAYETTE

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Knowing the structure of your Cox channel guide is one thing, but

quickly finding what you want requires a few smart strategies. Here are some tips for Lafayette residents.

## Channel Number Memory Tricks

Many Cox guides use a consistent numbering scheme that is easy to recognize. Typically, the HD version of a channel is the standard channel number plus 1000. For example, if **KATC (ABC)** is on channel 3, the HD version is on 1003. If **ESPN** is on 35, the HD version is on 1035. Memorizing this pattern helps you jump to the highest quality feed instantly.

## The Search Function is Your Best Tool

Do not spend ten minutes scrolling. Use the **Search** feature on your Cox Contour remote. Press the voice button (the one with the microphone) and simply say the name of the show, movie, or actor. For example, say "Find LSU Tigers football" or "Show me movies with Kevin Hart." The system will quickly display the channel and the air time.

## Customizing Your Favorites

Because the full channel guide includes hundreds of options, it is wise to create a **Favorites** list. You can easily add channels you watch regularly to this list and then toggle the guide to show only your favorites. This is a game-changer for households with multiple viewers who just want to quickly find their own go-to channels. For example, you might add **KLFY (10)**, **KATC (3)**, **TBS (31)**, **ESPN (35)**, **HBO (301)**, and **Hallmark (189)** to your personal list.

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### TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON GUIDE ISSUES

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What happens when your channel guide seems wrong or channels are missing? This can be frustrating, but several solutions are usually simple.

## Outdated Guide Data

Sometimes, your cable box needs to refresh. If your guide is showing "No Information" or is missing channels, try performing a reset. Unplug your Contour box or cable box from the power outlet, wait 30 seconds, and plug it back in. This forces the box to reconnect to Cox's network and download the latest channel lineup. This often resolves temporary glitches.

# Missing Channels

If you notice a specific channel is consistently missing from your Cox channel guide in Lafayette, it could be a billing issue or a change in the package structure. First, log into your Cox account online and verify your package. If the channel is listed as part of your package, it might be a subscription error. Contacting Cox customer support (available through the app or phone) is usually the fastest fix. They can "push" a refresh signal to your box to restore the channels.

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## STAYING UPDATED ON LINEUP CHANGES

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Channel lineups change periodically. A contract with a network might be renewed without changes, or a network might be moved to a different tier. How do you stay informed?

The best way is to check the official **Cox Channel Lineup page** for your specific Lafayette area. You can also enable notifications on the Cox Contour app. When a change happens, such as a new

channel launching (like a local subchannel for a new network) or a channel moving to a new number, the app will alert you. Local community forums on Facebook or Nextdoor are also surprisingly good sources for hearing about channel changes from other Lafayette subscribers.
